Terms and Conditions

1. This permit is non-transferable and is for the use of the vessel listed above, except on a temporary basis and at the discretion of the Long Island Harbor Master. It is illegal to rent a mooring without a federal permit.
2. Locations of NEW moorings will be approved by the Long Island Harbor Master.
3. Holder of the mooring permit is responsible for setting the mooring and making adjustments as required for the safety of the vessel named in the application and other adjacent vessels.
4. Mooring permit numbers **MUST** be painted on the mooring ball (buoy) in at least three (3) inch characters of contrasting color.
5. The valid mooring permit sticker must be affixed on the port side of the vessel immediately following the state registration number or on the port bow of a documented vessel.
6. If any vessel on a permitted mooring is taking on water or is deemed a hazard or menace to navigation, the Harbor Master may authorize a private contractor to take necessary action to mitigate the situation at the expense of the owner. The owner must pay the contractor within sixty (60) days, or mooring privileges will be revoked.
7. Moorings should be inspected every two (2) years.
8. The mooring under this permit must be in the assigned location by June 1st of the permit year or the location may be reassigned according to the waiting list priority. Moorings not registered at that time will be considered abandoned, cut loose or removed, and their location reassigned unless prior arrangements have been made with the Harbor Master. Abandoned moorings may be sold for the cost of removal or storage.

These terms and conditions are not complete or comprehensive. Refer to the Town of Long Island ordinances for full listings.

Moorings permits expire December 31st.
