

## **Minutes of Meeting**

**June 28, 2018**

### **Board of Selectmen**

### **Town of Long Island**

Present: Chair, Marie Harmon, Selectmen Joe Donovan, Paul Watts; Brian Dudley, Town Administrator.

The meeting was convened at 5:00 PM with a quorum.

Selectmen reviewed the weekly Town Warrants.

The board reviewed the draft minutes of the June 21, 2018 meeting.

- It was Moved (Donovan), Seconded (Watts) and Voted to approve the minutes of the meeting of June 21, 2018. (Motion passed 3-0).

The board reviewed its weekly correspondence. There was a communication regarding the shoreland zoning that was referred to the Code Enforcement Officer.

The board met with Mark Greene to review the format for the flag raising ceremony on Sunday, July the 1st.

The board met with Brad Brown of the Planning Board to discuss their current work projects on conditional uses and septic inspection requirements in the shoreland zones.

Amy and Brian briefed the board on the Wellness Center project. Construction is nearly complete. Flooring is due to arrive on July the 2nd.

There was discussion on parking tickets. The board reiterated its long standing position that parking tickets will not be waived.

The Clerk also reported that the number of dog registrations has increased since the courtesy public notice was issued. There are still two unregistered dogs on the island. It is imperative that all dogs be registered so there is proof of rabies vaccinations.

The board met with Ed McAleney to discuss the hanging of additional flags on the island.

Chairman Harmon discussed the idea of an Info Line to further improve communications with residents.

The board met with Captain Scott Stewart of the Cumberland County Sheriff's Office along with Deputy Sheriff Schnupp and Constable John Wallace. There was a wide-ranging discussion on animals, vehicle registrations, unlicensed drivers and speeding.

Captain Stewart agreed to more off-season random patrols of the island.

Brian briefed the board on the following:

- 1) Brian is meeting with Casella to discuss an overhaul of the trash and cardboard compactors at the Transfer Station. Activity at the Transfer Station has been very high. Five (5) replacement cans came in this week. Brian will be scheduling the removal of electronics and freon appliances from the Transfer Station in July. There will also be another Household Hazardous Materials pick up day scheduled.
- 2) The legal notice for the resurfacing of the tennis courts has been posted in the Portland Press Herald.
- 3) Brian indicated that two people had reached out regarding the Community Center Coordinator position.
- 4) Brian referred a communication on the pottery room to Zoeth.

The meeting adjourned at 7:15 PM. The next meeting of the Board is July 12, 2018.
