COVID – 19 UPDATES

CASCO BAY LINES

In the event that a passenger self-reports that they are experiencing symptoms of COVID-19, or have tested positive, a small number of masks have been made available aboard each boat. That passenger should wear a mask and find a secluded area to sit for the duration of the trip. There should be no other passengers or crew in close contact with the individual for the duration of the trip.

The affected passenger should be the last one to disembark and their seating area should be disinfected using any and all necessary precautions, once back at the dock.

Please understand, if/when this situation occurs, that some passengers must make the trip for medical attention and CBL is the lifeline for this travel. Should the passenger refuse to wear a mask, and/or sit in a secluded area of the boat, at the captain's discretion, transportation service to that passenger may be denied. Please contact Nick Mavodones for any clarification.

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and disinfecting supplies are onboard each vessel and at the Terminal.

There is a special conference call meeting of the CBL Board of Directors Thursday morning, March the 19th to discuss a resolution authorizing the General Manager and the President of the Board to jointly make any decision regarding the sailing schedule, terminal hours of operation, and temporary reduction or suspension of service if an insufficient number of crew members are available.

MAINE STATE LEGISLATURE

The legislature passed emergency legislation allowing municipal boards to conduct municipal meetings remotely via teleconferencing or video conferencing. The Board

has just received a summary of the new laws and is looking at their impact for Long Island and the specialized equipment that may be needed.

VEHICLES & TRAILERS

(From Governors Emergency Declaration)

Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 29-A, chapter 5 or any other law or municipal charter provision or ordinance to the contrary, a registration, **including a temporary registration**, of a vehicle, including, without limitation, a motor vehicle, all-terrain vehicle, watercraft or snowmobile, or a trailer required to be registered in this State that expires during the period of a state of emergency declared by the Governor in accordance with Title 37-B, section 742 due to the outbreak of COVID-19 is deemed extended until 30 days following the termination of the state of emergency.

PROPERTY TAX PAYMENTS
